WHAT IS THE TEEN DRIVER PROGRAM? Although young drivers represent only 6% of the nation's licensed drivers, they account for 14.8% of fatal crashes. The National Safety Council's Teen Driver program is a one-hour unique and motivational approach focused on resolving these issues. **Parents, who are encouraged to bring their teen drivers,** will gain valuable insight as to how they can (1) use proven methods to help reduce teen drivers' exposure to risk, (2) modify risky teen driving behavior, and (3) help their teen develop better driving skills and experience.

WE ARE ON A MISSION TO INFORM PARENTS OF TEEN DRIVERS THAT THEY CAN BEAT THE ODDS.

- Traffic crashes are the leading cause of teen fatalities, accounting for 44% of teen deaths in the U.S. annually.
- Teenagers driving at night and with passengers are 4-5 times more likely to crash than are teenagers driving alone during the day.
- Young drivers are involved in traffic crashes at over twice the rate of the rest of the population.
- Annually, more than 3,800 young drivers are killed and more than 326,000 are injured.
- Maryland reported at least 60 fatalities among drivers aged 16-19 in 2004.
